# Summertime....

As Lutheran's we are proud bearers of the reformation legacy. A legacy that calls us to be constantly mindful of the ways we do church. One of the principles of the reformation was that worship should make sense to the people gathered. Worship is not something that you watch or observe but an



active meaningful engagement with God and community. During the Reformation, the words of the worship service were changed to reflect the local language, people were allowed to sing again in church, everyone took communion (not just the priests). All of those principles of being relevant to the community are still true for us today. And so we are the church that was reformed and we continue to be reforming as our culture and society are always changing. We continue to witness to the good news of Jesus Christ in ways that make sense to the members of our society.

That beings said, I am excited to try something new this summer. While we switch to our summer worship schedule, **9am on Sunday**, we will also be offering a new worship service at **7pm on Wednesdays starting July 10<sup>th</sup>**. It will be a church service at a different time and with a different feel from what we've done before. Some folks work on Sunday, or can't get up that early, sports, camping, skiing, all compete with our Sunday morning worship schedule. So why not a Wednesday evening option? For some of you worship will remain a Sunday morning experience, some of you might attend both, others may only show up on Wednesdays. The service will be rooted in our Lutheran liturgy but in a contemporary way. It will be different from the usual first or second services.

There are lots of fun and important activities to be involved in this summer, from camping to hiking, VBS and progressive dinners. Make sure to join in! Keep an eye on the website or newsletter calendars for more information.

Finally, as we slip into summer mode I want you to make sure to remember our three watch words: **Relational, Intentional, and Incarnational.** Summer is the perfect opportunity to invite your friends to a church event, have another church family over for dinner, meet someone for a cup of coffee, and invest in the relationships in your community. Be intentional about sharing your faith and life with others. And remember that you are the presence of Christ in the world. We live out the kingdom of God with our whole lives.

# book of faith

### PAUL & THE CHURCH—PART 4

Over the last several months we have been looking at what it means to be the Church. We are currently exploring various aspects of Paul's image of the Church as the Body of Christ. We discussed the fact that Christ is the <u>Head</u> of the Body. Then we focused on <u>unity</u>, and spoke of its importance to the Church's witness in the world. This article will look at <u>diversity</u>.

Let's begin by reviewing a few facts about the Body of Christ. The Body of Christ—the Church—was formed after the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. It is made up of followers of Christ. Believers are united with Christ and with one another through baptism (which is our entrance into the Body). All believers are on the same level within the Body—no one is better or worse. All have sinned and fall short of God's glory, and the only reason any of us are in the Body is because of God's grace. The purpose of the Church is to bear witness to Christ in the world, to share the gospel so all may believe and come to salvation, and to be God's hands and feet on earth.

In order to accomplish the Church's mission, the Body of Christ must value *unity* (a spirit of oneness and common purpose that happens when individual parts are joined together to constitute a whole) and *diversity* (recognizing and appreciating the variety of gifts, abilities, life experiences, and perspectives that each member brings to the Body). Paul's writings on the Body of Christ treat unity and diversity as essential, inseparable components (see Rom. 12, 1 Cor. 2, Eph. 4). The Body cannot function effectively without a strong commitment to both. *Diversity* provides a variety of parts (members) to fill the needed functions. *Unity* binds those parts together into a complete body which works together to accomplish the common purpose.

How do we see diversity expressed in the Body of Christ? In the above referenced Scriptures, Paul indicates that the Holy Spirit has given all believers different gifts. A variety of gifts are listed in these passages, but the purpose of all gifts is to build up the Body. *"The gifts he gave were... to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ, until all of us come to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to maturity, to the measure of the full stature of Christ. We must no longer be children, tossed to and fro and blown about by every wind of doctrine...But speaking the truth in love, we must grow up in every way into him who is the head, into Christ, from whom the whole body, joined and knit together by every ligament with which it is equipped, as each part is working properly, promotes the body's growth in building itself up in love" (Eph. 4).* 

Another way diversity is expressed is through differences in cultural or religious backgrounds. Paul demonstrates that the Body is made up of Jews and Gentiles, male and female, slave and free. People of every possible variety under the sun are welcome in the Body of Christ. Each person brings a unique combination of strengths and weaknesses, life experiences, and perspectives to the Body. That uniqueness is a gift that brings greater fullness to the ministry of the Church.

What are the gifts of diversity? It helps us realize that we *need* each other—even those who are least like us. The Church needs many, many parts to be a complete Body. It gives us permission to focus on the area of ministry to which God has called and equipped us instead of trying to do a little bit of everything. We are expected to do *our* part to the best of our ability, and allow others to do their part. Finally, it encourages us to recognize and appreciate the God-given differences between ourselves and others because that is what makes the Body complete. Praise God for diversity in the Church!

#### **Entry Stained Glass Created by Tom Hemmen**

*Elements are:* The hand of Christ with wound; the hand of man rising from the world. overcoming both moral death and physical death. The hands represent union of Christ and man together with the Eucharistic chalice (abstract behind hands). Rising from the chalice is a cross of red and gold, suggesting that Chris's death on the cross freed man from moral death if he extends his hand for Jesus' aid. The purple color at the very top is the garment symbolic of the sacrificial offering Christ made of Himself for us. The entire design is meant to act as an introductory message prior to one's entering the sanctuary.



#### **Memorial Stained Glass Window**

On November 18, 1962, the stained glass window above the altar was dedicated. It was paid for by Memorial Funds at a cost of \$460. The window was installed with the help of a Puget Power Lift Truck.

Psalm 121 is portrayed in our stained glass window. See the Mountain in all three panels. The Cross is the symbol of God's supreme help to man in His Son, Our Savior. The Rent Curtain tells us that Christ's sacrifice opened the way to God. God gives us the blessings of the cross through the Word and Sacraments. The Dove and Three Streams of Water depict Baptism. The Grapes, Chalice and Wheat represent Holy Communion. A **Path** leads from the **Cross**. Our Christian life begins at the cross, and in this life the Lord is our keeper. The Sun is in the top left panel. The Moon and Stars are in the top right panel. The Fire on both sides of the path, center panel, symbolizes the temptations and trials of life. In the Christian life pathway, the Lord leads us into Faith, Hope and Love. You may find Your Home in the bottom of either side panel. The Lord keeps us in His loving care in this life, and He keeps us for all eternity in the heavenly home He has prepared for us.

### **Mount Si Lutheran Church's Rich History Trivia**

December 8, 1963 the new seven rank pipe organ is dedicated. The total Cost is \$6350.

**June 1965** The stained glass window in the entryway is installed for \$140.

- September 12, 1965 Rev. Armin Reitz leaves Mount Si Lutheran
- November 21, 1965 Rev. Wesley L. Sackmann installed at Mount Si Lutheran
- March 1966 Congregation votes to purchase additional five lots for \$5500 for future expansion.
- January 1967 Building committee is established to plan for Education & Fellowship Building.
- April 15, 1973 Ground breaking for the new building held on Palm Sunday. Funding came from member donations and a bank loan.
- September 16, 1973 Education & Fellowship building is dedicated.

"This building was built by three paid workers with a great deal of support from volunteers. The project which the architect estimated would cost \$120,000 was built for approximately \$60,000" (Fred Marshall).

I thank my God every time I remember you, constantly praying with joy in every one of my prayers for all of you, because of your sharing in the gospel from the first day until now. I am confident of this, that the one who began a good work among you will bring it to completion by the day of Jesus Christ. (Phi 1:3-6)

Thank you does not seem to do it. I keep saying it and the reality of all that we have done together means I need to say it again. I do appreciate the variety of the expressions of

love and thanksgiving that were part of the Synod Assembly. The event on Thursday evening was memorable and much appreciated. To see the variety of people from various places around the synod and the church makes me appreciate the unique view which this office has granted me to see what God is up to in this synod.

My memories of that night will always contain the singing of the choir and the congregation. Lutherans do know how to sing. When we get together the joyful noise of God's people gives hope and joy to those who experience the richness of the music.

Several friends noticed my pause and concentration on the final benediction at worship on Thursday. I did reflect on the privilege and the power of being able to speak God's blessing on God's people gathered as the Northwest Washington Synod. I may have been the one speaking the words, but the benediction that night was a blessing to me that I will treasure.

One of the joys and comforts of this office has been the knowledge that you, as individuals and as congregations pray for your bishops each week. Being in congregations and hearing that we are praying for our Bishops, Mark and Chris, continues to be a source of strength and comfort as the work presents itself. I ask you to include bishop-elect Kirby in that petition and on August 1<sup>st</sup> to pray regularly for Bishop Unti and all that he will face in the coming years.

The July Synod Council meeting will be my last one after 20 years. I served two terms as a member of the council and two terms as bishop. It has been a privilege to serve Christ's church in this way.

You are in my prayers in the days ahead. In that prayer I will continue to give thanks for you knowing that the good work begun among you will be brought to completion by the day of Jesus Christ. Thanks be to God.



#### Unti Elected Bishop Of ELCA Northwest Washington Synod

The Rev. B. Kirby Unti was elected on May 19 to a six-year term as bishop of the Northwest Washington Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) at the 2013 Synod Assembly held in Lynnwood. Unti, 61, is the pastor of St. Matthew's Lutheran Church in Renton, Wash.

The incumbent bishop, the Rev. Wm Chris Boerger, elected in 2001 and re-elected in 2007, was term limited. Unti, who led on all ballots, was elected on the fourth ballot for bishop, 230-151 over the Rev. Jeffrey Russell, Central Lutheran Church, Everett. There were 15 nominees on the first ballot. Unti will assume the bishop's office on August 1.

The installation date has been set for **September 15 (see pg. 4).** The Rev. Mark Hanson, Presiding Bishop of the ELCA, will install bishop-elect Unti. Unti was born in Spokane, Wash. He earned a bachelor's degree from the University of Washington in 1974. He earned a master of divinity from Pacific Theological Seminary. He was ordained in May 1978. Unti served as the Assistant Pastor at Faith Lutheran Church in Bellingham. In 1980, Unti became pastor at St. Matthew's Lutheran Church in Renton. Unti and his wife, Kim, are parents to four grown children.


