

HOLY WEEK

Grace and peace to you brothers and sisters in Christ!

We come again to the wonder, joy, sorrow, mystery and beauty of Holy Week. Holy week begins with Palm Sunday as Jesus enters Jerusalem for the last time. We shout Hosanna and wave our branches to welcome the King! Then, on Thursday we gather to remember the meal Jesus shared with his disciples in the upper room. We eat and hear Jesus proclaim that the bread is his body and the wine his blood given and shed for all people. With anger and grief we witness Judas seek to betray Jesus into the hands of the authorities. We struggle to keep awake with Jesus as he prays in the garden of Gethsemane. Then, Friday comes and we are confronted with human fear that leads to Jesus' crucifixion...those who followed Jesus are scattered, lost and undone. In shock and disbelief, Jesus dies, is wrapped and anointed and placed in a tomb with a stone to guard the way. We leave our Friday worship with a glimpse into that night of sorrow...but, we know something the disciples did not know when they stood before the sealed tomb....we know that humanity's act of death (an act that is so falsely understood to be humanity's greatest power)...we know that act of death could not defeat our Lord and our Savior, Jesus the Christ, the Son of God. Jesus absorbs humanity's worst and reflects back to us LIFE. We humans, when pushed to the limit, see our ability to inflict death on other creatures and humans as some ultimate control and show of our authority. Jesus knew this. Jesus accepted this about the people he came to heal, teach, challenge and love. On Easter morning, staring in the empty tomb, we learn who is really in charge...who really holds the power, the authority and control. God. God looks at the death we cause and overwhelms it with LIFE. Love—Infinite—For—Everyone. We give thanks in the face of that empty tomb that Jesus lives! Jesus is more than the death we create. Humbled we realize that Jesus is willing to even forgive the death we perpetrate. In shock we again are faced with the mystery of our faith....Jesus is so in love with all creation that he takes the death we dealt and turns it into the promise of life eternal, life abundant, life today, life for all. 

CHILDREN, YOUTH, FAMILY

A HUGE thank you to everyone who supported our first annual auction. The community support from local vendors was amazing and we were able to enjoy a great night of fun and fellowship with new and old friends. It was a lot of hard work, but the event turned out to be a great success. We raised over \$5070 for the Snoqualmie Valley Foodbank and right around \$12,000 for our Raise the Roof Campaign. I am ecstatic to report that we have entered into a contract with Cornerstone Roofing Company out of Bothell, Washington. We have sent in our 20% down payment and work will begin weather permitting after May 20th. Currently, we have raised \$92,000.00. We will continue with our fundraising efforts throughout the spring and summer.

As spring rolls bye, please be checking our sign-up sheets and upcoming projects and activities. A few important events to look forward to.... We will be working on an outreach service project for House of Hope on Thursday, April 11th from 2-4 pm. All ages encouraged to come and help. We will be creating Easter baskets for the families.

We will begin Holy Week with Palm Sunday and a fun welcoming twist, Maundy Thursday will begin at 6:30pm with a dinner and service (please bring a side-dish to share). Good Friday will be at 7pm at Mount Si and our traditional Easter Sunday 8:15 and 10:45 services.

Why Bible Study? Isn't Reading Enough?

Why are we having a class in Bible STUDY...isn't reading the Scriptures enough?

Well, yes and no. Reading the Bible is enough depending on how you understand reading. Sometimes we are not very good at reading. Being able to read the words just isn't all reading is about. Often we really don't read very well. I'm reminded of the two men who did know how to pray very well. They were walking on a train track in a very narrow tunnel. When the train approached at high speed they saw they could not get out of the way nor run fast enough. One turned to the other and suggested that they pray though neither had done much praying. One said to the other; "Well, the only prayer I know is a table prayer I learned as a child." So they stopped in the middle of the track and folded their hands, bowed their heads and the second man prayed; "Lord, we thank you for what we are about to receive!" Hopefully the same is not like our Bible reading!

Most of us haven't had much reading instruction since we were in grade school, our reading instruction stopped when we were able to recognize the words. Reading has both attitudes and skills, and then there are results. So what are the attitudes, skills, and results of reading? Our Bible study class will explain all three in greater detail as they relate to reading God's Word. For now just understand that the results of reading the Bible are moving from less to more, having the joy of discovery, and being able to read what one does not first understand.

The Scriptures say we should "study to show yourselves approved unto God, rightly dividing the Word of Truth." What does that mean?

Let me ask you to remember how you read the first love letter you received. You noticed and thought about every word. You asked questions like; what does he/she mean by using this word or that phrase, is the order of the letter saying anything important, what are they not saying, ect. You read the letter more than once didn't you! And then you looked at the closing, the summing up, the final word...did it contain that special word you were hoping for? I'll remind you that none of us read our first love letter like we read a bill from the power company, or a letter from a lawyer, or a shopping list! So how then should we read the Scriptures?

I'm reminded of the quote; "Everybody talks about the weather, but nobody does anything about it" (Charles Dudley Warner, 1897)

Everyone says we should study the Bible, but nobody tells us how!

If that sounds true to you, I invite you to The Joy of Discovery in Bible Study. The book we will be using is the same title by the author Oletta Wald. This class sign up will begin soon!

I work at the Huntington Learning Center in North Bend as a tutor. The Center is enrolling more students all the time and needs more tutors. I work mostly with the youngest kids 1:1 in grades 1-3. Sometimes I work with grades 4-12 in a 4:1 ratio. SAT/ACT Test prep (which I don't do) is 1:1. I thought there might be folks in our church who are interested. It's part time, various shifts M-Th 3pm-8pm and Saturday 10am -2pm. Work as many or as few hours as you want. Sometimes I work for only 2 hours, other times I work 5 in a single day. I used to work on M & W only, now I'm working 5 days a week. Great people to work with and super kids! The best part is not having to plan the curriculum or program, just use the pieces the computer assigns. And each curriculum piece has easy to use instructional procedures. I don't have a teaching degree but I did homeschool my 2 children. (And have an M.Div.) The training is paid. (Computer modules and shadowing.) If you might be interested in some part time work helping kids improve academically, please contact Huntington Learning Center at 425-246-3569. 

Lent: A Time To Take Seriously How God Seeks In Us A Change Of Heart And Mind Bishop Kirby
Unti I love the season of Lent because Lent both acknowledges my utter humanity and creates a holy space for grace. This is vital for me because sometimes my own fear clouds my vision of God's

expansive love. As I was contemplating this, I remembered an image I used to doodle on my notes whenever I was in class or attending a meeting. I would draw two parallel and offset squares and then join them together, so they looked like 3D box whose sides, top and bottom are transparent. Then I would stare at the 3D image only to discover that it would completely change its image. Typically, I first see the box as if I am looking at it straight on. Then after blinking my eyes several time the box would flip, and I would see it as if looking through its top. The same box but when seen with new perspective it completely changes. It is rather embarrassing to say now but I did not immediately embrace the idea of women as pastors. Fifty years ago, as an 18-year-old male, I couldn't imagine a pastor being a woman. I didn't have the language or knowledge to know that my perceptions -my own maleness -was being threatened. I was being dislodged from my comfortable, and soon to be stale, understanding of the church. Truthfully, it would be a few years before I experienced a shift in thinking. As I attended seminary with women candidates and became friends with women pastors, my fear began to give way to my experience of discovering the added gift, perspective, heart and wisdom that ordained women were blessing the church with. I look back with regret at how narrow my understanding was of what it means to be the body of Christ where every part is valued and essential to vitality. This journey challenged me to overcome my fear and ignorance. Through the years I have added to this experience of learning to see God's love more fully in a number of ways: •welcoming siblings in the LGBTQIA community into the church, into ordination and marriage. •discovering the rich diversity that comes from honoring the call of Deacons to ordination and their rightful place of service in the

church. Coming understand the Black Lives Matter movement and its challenge to white male privilege. Recognizing more fully the history of the destruction of the land and lives of our Native American people. Coming to see how my consumer formed mindset leads to the destruction of the earth. This is by no means an exhaustive list, nor do I want to imply that I have completely moved from fear and resistance, there are days when it's one step forward and two back. My life has been a life long journey of learning, changing and gaining new perspective. I thank God that God has been patient with me, gracious, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love. This Lenten season I invite you to lean into God's gracious Holy Space where a change of heart gains courage. +BKU
