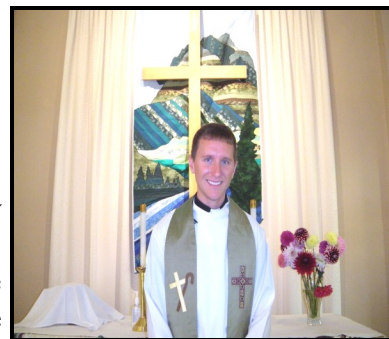
Many people report an after Christmas depression. After the marketed holiday expectations, how could reality possibly meet our projections? A letdown ensues.

## THE NEW YEAR

Happy New Year! The first of January often brings a time of reflection. It is a chance to look back at the previous year and to look forward to the year ahead. As followers of Christ, let's look at a few things we might want to ponder at this time of year.

When we look back over the last year(s), we need to be willing to accept all of it—both good and bad. There will always be trials, disappointments, and even failures. They are part of the human condition. And these challenges help us grow in our relationship with God. But there will also be many good moments to reflect on. We need to take time to thank God for the many blessings we have received—special times with family and friends, enjoying the beauty of God's creation, feeling God's presence in the midst of a difficulty. It is important to look back and embrace the lessons learned. But don't get stuck in the past. If we drive looking in the rearview mirror, we'll end up in the ditch. So look ahead.

At this time of year, we also spend time reflecting on the future. Here are some things to consider. First, we need to remember our identity. We are the children of God Almighty, the One True God. We are *chosen* by God, *redeemed* by the blood of Jesus Christ, *adopted* into the family, *sanctified* and *set apart* to be God's holy people, and *called* to live in a way that reflects God's presence, character, and love.

Second, we need to look ahead without fear. *“I hereby command you: Be strong and courageous; do not be frightened or dismayed, for the Lord your God is with you wherever you go (Joshua 1:9).”* As children of God, we know that we are never alone. God will be by our side. *We “can do all things through him who strengthens” us (Phil. 4:13).* When we feel anxious about the future, all we have to do is recall God's past faithfulness. Then we can move forward with faith, hope and courage.

Third, as we set our goals and resolutions for the coming year, we need to ask God to guide and direct our plans. Our lives belong to God, so our time and energies need to be dedicated to God's priorities. What does *God* want to accomplish in and through our lives this year? *“For surely I know the plans I have for you, says the Lord, plans for your welfare and not for harm, to give you a future with hope” (Jer. 29:11).* We need to trust and believe that God's plan will be better than anything we come up with on our own. Then we pray that God will give us courage to follow wherever we are led.

Dear Heavenly Father, we praise you for the past year. We thank you for the many blessings we received, and for the challenges that caused us to become more dependent on you. Help us to carry forward the lessons we learned, and to leave behind the unnecessary baggage. As we enter 2014, help us move forward hand in hand with You. Thank you for the reminder that we are your children and that we are always in your care. We know that our lives are not our own. Rather, they belong to you. Guide our steps, Lord, in the way that you would have us go. And give us the courage to follow where you lead. Help us to be faithful and positive witnesses for you. In this often dark world we live in, help us to *“let our light shine before men in such a way that they may see our good works, and glorify our Father who is in heaven” (Matt. 5:16).* Amen.

### **Adult Education**

This winter the adult class will be reading and discussing a book about theologian Paul Tillich. Pastor Mark will lead us through these conversations. Grab a cup of coffee and join us in the library for lively conversation & fellowship. We meet at **9:45 am**.

About the book: Tillich: A Brief Overview of the Life and Writings of Paul Tillich by Daniel Peterson.

This volume introduces readers to the life and work of Paul Tillich, a theologian who is virtually unknown outside academic circles. This book provides smaller bite-sized introductions to make the journey into his thought world easier for newcomers who are curious to learn more.

Considered at the height of his career to be “the most dangerous theologian alive” for challenging conventional notions of God, Paul Tillich (1886-1965) exercised a major influence on twentieth century American Christian thought. A native of Germany, Tillich immigrated to America after openly defying Hitler and the Nazi regime. By the end of his life he had made the cover of TIME magazine as America’s “premier” Protestant intellectual, his thought becoming the subject of hundreds of books, articles and dissertations—including one written by Martin Luther King, Jr.

Yet for all his popularity at the time, Tillich became virtually unknown to American audiences by the end of the twentieth century. In this brief introduction to his work, Dr. Daniel Peterson makes the case for Tillich’s broader relevance again as a theologian who can take us beyond the extremes of fundamentalist religion and empty skepticism to a deeper religious faith or spiritual path open to doubt and questioning.

This contemporary romance received both a Christy Award in 2012 and a Carol Award as well – presented by the American Christian Fiction Writers organization. To help us sort out some contemporary issues in the church, we also feature: **What Christianity Is Not** by Douglas John Hall: With so many dogmatic differences, how can the Christian Church hope to unite? And finally a beloved classic: **The Imitation of Christ** by Thomas ‘a Kempis: Kempis, an Augustinian Monk, wrote this meditation on the spiritual life between 1420 and 1427. ### **Mt. Si's Second Epiphany Bonfire—Sunday, January 5, 2014**

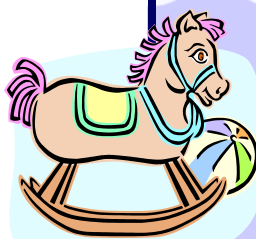

## Council Corner!

At the Nov. 24, 2013 scheduled congregational meeting, we did not have a quorum to vote on fiduciary matters, so the meeting was rescheduled for Dec. 15, 2013. At the November meeting, those present did vote to approve the request for Mount Si Lutheran Church to sponsor the winter shelter beginning Jan., 2014 for 45 days.

At the December 15 meeting, on behalf of the Stewardship & Finance Committee, Bob Bartlett and Jeff King presented the 2014 Proposed Budget with one revision to add \$1,127 to the total budget. Bob explained that this amount is to allow for the addition of medical benefits being paid for a new Family & Youth Director taking into consideration the new health care bill. This raised the proposed budget amount to \$247,572.00. After a period of review, discussion, and questions, the congregation voted favorably to approve this new amount and the 2014 Proposed Budget was approved by majority vote.

A candidate for the Family & Youth Director position has been selected and we await the acceptance of a job offer. Please stay tuned for an update as we anticipate filling this position very soon.

As 2013 comes to a close, we say good-bye to John Cassidy and Rick Rodriguez who have both stepped down from their council positions to pursue other interests in the church. We wish to say **THANK YOU** to both John and Rick for their devoted service as the President and Vice President on the church council and as active leaders of the congregation. We welcome two new members to the 2014 council. Debbie Spurling and Kelly Luna were unanimously approved by written ballot to serve on council. Thank you to all of the members of 2013 council and to those continuing to serve through 2014. The council will be voting on the executive committee at the upcoming January council meeting.

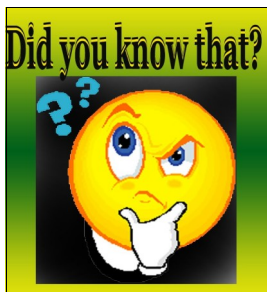

## Mount Si Lutheran Church's Rich History Trivia

- **December 10, 2009** Due to extreme cold temperatures, a pipe broke in the Library causing water damage to Library and into Fellowship Hall. After our deductible, this was covered by our insurance with Zurich North America. Renovations were done by Alliance Restorative SVC, Inc. Determined the carpet would need to be replaced in Library and Fellowship Hall.
- **April 5-9, 2010** New carpet installed in Library, Fellowship Hall and office side.
- **April 18, 2010** Mount Si Community Garden is completed and after a garden blessing, we began planting the first seeds.
- **February 12, 2012** Mount Si's old wooden church sign was removed and replaced by a new lighted sign board that we can publicize worship times and events. The sign was donated by a generous, anonymous donor.
- **February 19, 2013** Removal of steeple from former Calvary Lutheran Church in Ballard, WA and transported steeple safely to Mount Si Lutheran Church property. The steeple was stored until a platform base was built in order to erect the new steeple.

- **June 4, 2013** Following the installation of the steel platform frame, the new steeple was successfully positioned on top of Mount Si Lutheran Church. Tom Burnside designed and built the steel platform, along with help from Inge & Carsten Burnside. After the steeple was placed on the platform, the steel platform was covered with white vinyl siding to match the church siding.
- **September 29, 2013** Mount Si Lutheran Church had a steeple dedication and celebration. Special guests included the congregation from Calvary Lutheran Church which merged with Our Redeemer's Lutheran Church after Calvary Lutheran closed.

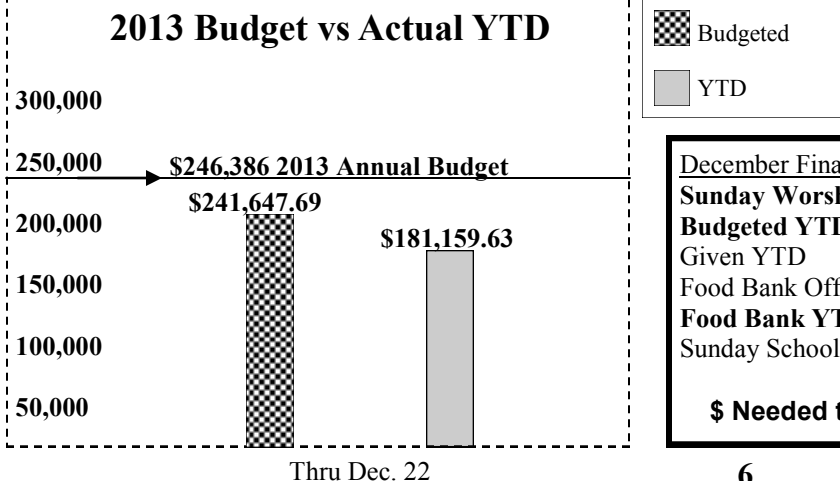

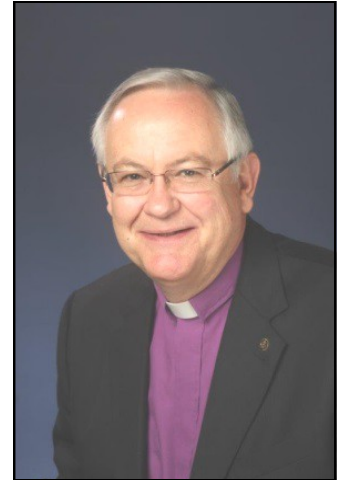

## Young People a Source of Good News

It is always good to enter the New Year with some Good News! Take a look around our typical Lutheran congregation and you may not see a lot of younger people in the pews. It would be easy to conclude that our young people are no longer participating in the church. Could we be looking in the wrong place to see them?

When I was back in Pittsburgh for the ELCA Churchwide Assembly this year there were a record number of youth and young adult voting members. They were not only present but they made their voices heard on many issues. I was so impressed with how composed and articulate they were.



It is also worth rejoicing in the fact that we have a growing number of young adults applying to participate in the Young Adults in Global Mission Program. This program is growing with a goal of having 100 young people serving in ministry sites around the world. This year we have four young people from our synod serving: Gabe Moe-Lobeda, Luke Roehl, Abby Cress and Anna Guthrie.

There is also a surging interest in young people who want to serve domestically through Lutheran Volunteer Corps. Again, the applicants exceeded the number of positions available. Our LVC young adults are serving in some of the poorest communities in America and do so while living on a meager income. LVC unites volunteers with financial supporters, non-profit organizations and ministries to work for peace with justice across the nation, including an office here in Seattle.

Recently I attended a gathering of Ecumenical Partners at Seattle University some of whom just returned from the World Council of Churches in Korea. Guess what they said? They spoke of how impressed they were by the number of young adults who were present and actively engaged in the deliberations.

Add to this list a update I received about the United Nations Climate Change meeting in Warsaw where a group of seven Lutheran young adults have been leading the ecumenical and interfaith effort and initiating a fast, especially in solidarity with one of the leaders of the Filipino delegate who linked the lack of inaction with the devastation that has recently hit his homeland.

There are many more sightings that I am sure you could add to this list. Our young people care about this world and they want to be actively involved in serving it. We need to applaud them for putting their faith into action and encountering Jesus throughout the world.

Adding to their hearts of service, I increasingly value our young people because of their cultural competency and fluency. They know how to navigate this culture. This is a form of wisdom our church needs to value and lift up for leadership.

Jesus often had to redirect the eyes and ears of his followers so that they could see and hear the signs of the kingdom. I count our young people as a source of great news as we enter a New Year.

**Time 4 You:** Join other children & youth leaders to share the joys & challenges of ministry. Exchange ideas and connect with other leaders in the synod on the 3rd Thursday of the month.

**The Well Devotional:** We gather on the 1st Wednesday of each month for devotions/reflection time to focus on our personal spiritual journey.

The ELCA Young Adults in Global Mission (YAGM) program invites ELCA young adults ages 19-29 into a transformative, year-long journey in international service. They are shaped by the witness of our global neighbors, sharing in the journeys of companion churches and organizations in one of nine countries around the world. A year of service through the YAGM program invites young adults to become the hands and feet of Jesus in the world, providing critical support to ministries and projects in communities of need. It also invites volunteers into a journey of self reflection, providing space to consider their sense of identity, God's work in the world, and their place within it all. Young adults serve in the spirit of accompaniment, walking alongside global companions in a manner that practices mutuality, interdependence and solidarity. Areas of service include, but are not limited to, health and development, congregational ministry, human rights, education, homelessness, addiction recovery, women's issues and children and youth. All site placements provide opportunities for young adults to confront issues of wealth and poverty, racial privilege, economic disparity and globalization, all through the lens of faith.

Keeping touch with our young adults who are serving in YAGM is a wonderful opportunity for members of our congregations and for these fantastic folks who are spending time with sisters & brothers around the world:

- 1) Encourage your youth group to follow one of the YAGMs' blogs.
- 2) Include the YAGMs in your congregational prayers.
- 3) Invite your Sunday School classes to become e-mail pals with one of the YAGMs. Contact the Synod Office if you would like one of their email addresses.
- 4) Hold a Skype Q & A between a YAGM and your Adult Sunday School Class.

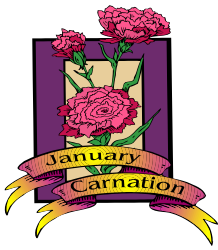

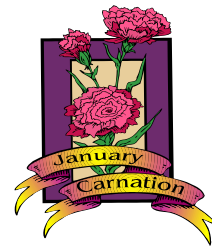
