We Gather at the Scene

Pastor: In 1865, William Chatterton Dix penned a poem that would become the beloved Christmas-time favorite, "What Child is This?" This year for Advent and Christmas, we have been prompted by this carol to ask deeper questions of Jesus' identity, "What child IS this?" When we look beyond the lullaby and behind the scenes, what we discover is that the answers are much more complicated than the lilting lullaby tune conveys. The time of Jesus' birth was fraught with difficulties. This is the scene into which Jesus was born. We are called, as his disciples, to enter the scene in the midst of our own complicated and difficult time in history, offering Hope, Peace, Joy, and Love as the Christ Child did. Let us sing together:

What Child is this, who, laid to rest, On Mary's lap is sleeping? Whom angels greet with anthems sweet, While shepherds watch are keeping?

Pastor: God so loved the world that God became us in order to know us, to love us, even more deeply. Not just the cross at the end of Jesus' life, but the difficulty of the time of Christ's birth can show us the reality of "God-with-us" no matter what. This is a theme from our faith story that can open our hearts to see our own place in the narrative of history. No matter how afraid we are, the Babe "whom shepherds guard and angels sing" lives within us waiting to grow into Hope, Peace, Joy, and Love incarnate.

Reader 1: We light these candles for those who need it most.

Reader 2: For all who need more Hope.

Reader 1: For all who yearn for Peace.

Reader 2: For all whose Joy lays dormant.

Reader 1: For all who need the salve of Love.

Reader 2: For all of who need this Child of Possibility.

Reader 1: Our question for this night at the scene of the nativity is this:

"How do the messages of this child reverberate into our time, our lives, our world?"

Reader 2: What child IS this? This, this, is Christ the King who reigns with hope, peace, joy, and love forever. Let us sing together,

This, this is Christ, the King,
Whom shepherds guard and angels sing:
Haste, haste to bring Him laud,
The Babe, the Son of Mary!

Prayer of Invocation

Here, at the nativity of your birth,
give us the courage to face this moment with humility and hope.
Open us to new understandings of
the unfolding story of your presence among us.
Show us the true meaning of the kingdom on earth as it is in heaven.

RESPONDING

Our faithful response is to praise God for this story of Emmanuel, God-With-Us, even and especially in the midst of difficulty, for God is indeed with us even still.

Prayers of the People

Pastor: In this moment of silent contemplation, we lift up our hopes for the world, for its people, for the kind of kingdom embodied by the child who became the Christ. We have been lifting up prayers during Advent by placing them on the city of Bethlehem "wall". You are invited to visit that display as you leave tonight, saying a silent prayer for all those who are suffering from the violence of this world, no matter where they are, what they believe, whether you understand or agree with the actions of any government. All people deserve peace and safety and we pray especially this night for "peace on earth." Let us pray:

Reader 2: Holy Living One, Child of Light, Spirit of Resilience, we come to you today weary of the violence of history. We know you are with us, for you came to our human story when we needed your message so much. We still do. Reader 1: We ask, "What child is this who we follow, and who are we in the scene of this unfolding story?" The manger heralds the truth, "We are not alone." We thank you for your presence breaking into our lives, showing us the light of hope, peace, joy, and love. And we ask for the courage to step into the scene, preparing the way for your reign.

Pastor: Please speak your own prayers aloud or in the silence of your hearts after each petition is shared:

We give you thanks, O God, this day...

We name our sorrow this day...

We ask for your healing presence to be with us this day...

We ask for your forgiveness this day...

As we ask for forgiveness we hear your response to our confession in the name of Jesus Christ, you are forgiven.

Be with us as we seek to be the Body of Christ in the world. We pray this in the way you taught us, saying together...

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name. Thy Kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us. Lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil for Thine is the Kingdom and the power and the glory, forever and ever, Amen.

Offering

Pastor: What gifts are adequate for the King of Kings, the Child of Light? Our theme song says "so bring him incense, gold, and myrrh; come peasant, king, to own him." Whether what we have to give is simply the gift of our presence and gratitude, or if we are privileged with coffers of precious resources, we give what we can. In this way, we "take ownership" of our role in the scene, in the unfolding story of Light in the dark corners.

COMMUNION

His own suffering at the hands of the elite ... in the power of your Word and Holy Spirit.

On the night in which he gave himself up for us, he took bread, gave thanks to you, broke the bread, gave it to his disciples, and said:

"Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you.

Do this in remembrance of me."

When the supper was over, he took the cup, gave thanks to you, gave it to his disciples, and said:

"Drink from this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, poured out for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins.

Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me."

Pour out your Holy Spirit on us gathered here,

. . .

By your Spirit, make us one with Christ, one with each other, and one in ministry to all the world, until Christ comes in final victory and we feast at his heavenly banquet. Amen.

All Singing: So, my friends and neighbors, Spirit leads the way May we welcome strangers, building trust each day.

May we live like Jesus in our time and place
'Til this weary nation knows amazing grace.

Amen. Thanks be to God! Come, let us gather at the table of amazing grace.

SENDING FORTH

Just as our theme carol asks, "What child is this?" we, too, have come with our questions this day. We go into the world with answers of Good News, being the Body of Christ through our words and deeds.

Lighting of Candles

The pastor lights a candle from the Christ candle; the ushers light their candles from the pastor's candle. The ushers then light the candle of each worshipper nearest the center aisle and then passed through the row. Silence until all candles are lit. (The unlit candle should be tipped when lighting it from a neighbor's candle so the lit candle doesn't drip wax if tipped.)

Once all candles are lit we continue with our worship.

WE ASK, WE ANSWER

As we prepare to go into the world, let us ask and answer the question we came with.

What child IS this?

This is the one born into a time when hope was hard.

What child IS this?

This is the one whose lowly status would send a message of peace with justice.

What child IS this?

This is the one who promises us joy even when life is difficult.

What child IS this?

This is the "King of Kings" who shows us the way of true love for all people.

What child IS this?

This, this, is the babe whose Light spreads through our lives to others and to the world.
