## MAY 2023 GOODNEWSletter

Grace and peace to you,

Over the next month in worship we will hear most of the 1st Letter of John read as our first lesson. 1 John is a short letter—only five chapters long and, to be fair, it is not so much a letter as it is a testimonial written by a community of faith. Notice the letter begins with, "we declare to you all what we have heard...what we have seen...what we have touched..." In Chapter two this language will shift to "I write," and we read that with the understanding that the author is



backed by a larger community. In other words, they are not writing alone.

I invite you to take time in the next month to read all of 1 John. As you do I would invite you to consider the following questions:

- What images of Jesus are presented?
- What descriptions or truths about Jesus are shared?
- What is the "new" commandment the community is encouraging the reader to obey?
- What does it mean to "abide in Jesus" and to "abide in love"?
- In Chapter 4, why is it important to test spirits to make sure they "confess Jesus has come in the flesh"?
- In Chapter 5 there is discussion about testimony and the Spirit that testifies—what is the testimony? Why are they testifying?

As you read through the 1 John I invite you consider another piece—since this is the testimony of a faith community—how might we write a testimony for this Mt Si Lutheran community of faith? What would be important to include about God, Jesus and the Spirit?

What would Mt Si Lutheran declare about what you all have heard, what you all have seen, what you all have touched?

I know God is at work in and among this faith community and has been for its whole history of nearly 75 years. In that time I trust you all have heard, seen and touched the truth of who God is, what Jesus has done for us and how the Spirit is active in and through us.

As we prepare to celebrate God's work at Mt Si Lutheran over the last 75 years I invite you to write down your stories of what you have seen, heard and touched. Also, write down the stories that have been passed down to you from those who have gone before us. It would be a great joy to share these stories with one another as we testify to the truth.

I pray the Spirit will speak to us as we study this text together. God's word is a powerful, beautiful, challenging, transformative gift to each of us. May God's word continue to encourage us in our faith and remind us of all the promises we have received. Amen.

#### COUNCIL REPORT

Greetings from your council.

The council has been monitoring our financial situation. Our unrestricted funds at the end of the quarter January through March were \$50,275.70 in our checking account and \$33,030.72 in our savings account which gives us a total \$83,306.42 in unrestricted funds. Our income for the first quarter January through March was \$36,121.70. Our expenses for the quarter were \$50,582.38 which is a deficit of \$14,460.68. This averages out to a deficit of approximately \$3,800 per month. Our budget for the same period is \$51,569.46. We are spending under our budget so the deficit is not due to overspending. Our income is averaging about \$2000.00 per month less than last year for the same period. We are planning to meet with a representative from the Synod to discuss options for increasing our income and/or reduce our expenditures.

We have signed a contract with a preschool to rent two of our unused Sunday school rooms for their operations. We have emptied the two rooms and removed a partition between them so that it is one large room. They will begin moving in May 1. We have identified an area for a playground and they will begin construction on it soon. They will be paying rent monthly and will begin full operation in September.

A new Alcoholics Anonymous group has begun using Luther's Lounge for weekly meetings on Thursday evenings. They will be entering through the Ogle Street entrance. They will be paying \$25.00 a month. We ask that you respect their privacy and refrain from entering Luther's Lounge during their meetings

Next year will be the 75 th anniversary of Mt Si Lutheran Church. The council is looking for ideas on what we might do to celebrate this event. If you have any ideas please share them with Pastor Krista or with a council member.

We still have a council vacancy that we would like to fill. We meet the second Tuesday of the month at 7:00 pm. If you are interested, let Pastor Krista or a council member know.

WELCOME TO MOUNTAIN VALLEY PRESCHOOL—The council has approved a three-year contract with Mountain Valley Preschool, run by local Keeley Harris, to utilize one of our larger upstairs classrooms and build a fenced playground area in part of our backyard property. Keeley will begin renovating and preparing the classroom and playground on May 1st. This classroom will be locked with a key for our use only in case of emergency.

This is a one room preschool with around 10 students participating. Class will begin in early September, M-F from 9-1pm. The church will receive compensation for this use of space. The current contract is \$500/mo. when students are present and \$350/mo. when students are not present. She does plan to run the preschool over the summer.

Our insurance has reviewed this building use and we have addressed all concerns. The Preschool will be separately insured with MSLC listed as additionally insured.



## WORSHIP NEWS-PENTECOST SUNDAY-May 28

In the church year, the day of Pentecost is the culmination of the 50 days of the Easter celebration. After showing himself to the disciples and after having ascended, Jesus' followers received the promised gift of the Holy Spirit. On the fiftieth day of Easter, our Lutheran worship is filled with festivity, color and movement as we both conclude the Easter celebration and welcome anew the gift of the Holy Spirit.

Many ELCA worshipers wear red on the festival of Pentecost, recalling the red of the flames of the Holy Spirit. You are invited to wear red to worship on **Sunday**, **May 28**<sup>th</sup> as a sign that the Holy Spirit comes to all the believers, not just the leaders of community. The wind of the Holy Spirit both forms the church and urges us outside the walls of the church to carry on the mission and ministry of Christ in the world. In preparation for Pentecost Sunday, read again Acts chapters One and Two and watch for how the Holy Spirit is working through the early Christian communities. Think about where you see the Holy Spirit at work today in our faith community, your life and in the world around you.

## **BISHOP'S LETTER**

## May 2023



Some synonyms for GATHERING that I found on the internet include: association, caucus, collection, conclave, conference, congregation, convention, crowd, function, group, mass, meeting, party, throng, acquisition, affair, aggregate, aggregation, band, body, bunch, clambake, company, concentration, concourse, congress, convocation, crush, drove, flock, gain, heap, herd, horde, huddle, junction, knot, levy, meet, muster, parley, pile, rally, roundup, society, stock, stockpile, swarm, turnout, union, get-together, social function.

Some of these GATHERING words sound positive to my ears (group, party, social function), some sound political or corporate (caucus, acquisition, convention, meeting), some sound a little scary (crush, drove, horde, swarm) and one just makes me smile (clambake). How is a clambake like a GATHERING? I'd love to hear your answer!

We are excited that this year we are having two GATHERINGS. As a congregation, you are welcome to choose either May 13 or May 20 to GATHER with people throughout the synod. While there is no limit on the number of people who may attend from your congregation, we do have to cap registration at 300 each Saturday, so we hope that you are coming and that you are already registered as you read this! These last few years have shown us that there is nothing better than GATHERING with the body of Christ, especially in-person. We are excited for all of us in our synod to come together as we share our God-given gifts and wisdom. We are excited for the knowledge that will be shared and, even more, the Spirit of hope, generosity, and anticipation for what is next.

We are excited to see you and your congregation at one of the GATHERINGs this year. We can't wait to GATHER together with you on May 13 or May 20 and into the future!
