# **Give Thanks!**

It seems every November my temptation is to write an article about the horror of seeing Christmas decorations in the big box stores. It does seem a little bizarre to see plastic Christmas trees up before Halloween, let alone



Thanksgiving. But tempting as it may be to critique the culture around us, fact is it's not new or even that interesting. In fact getting caught up in the critique might be just as distracting as the practice we are criticizing. A more interesting thought, is what are we doing to celebrate the season with practices and patterns that feel more authentic?

Thanksgiving, while not technically a religious holiday, is a wonderful time to practice gratefulness. It's a great time to look to all the things in your life you're grateful for. A time to reflect on all the relationships you have and how much better your life is because of them. Think about all the ways God has blessed your life. This is not always the way we see our lives—through the lens of gratefulness. That's why we call it a practice. Sometimes we have to practice this kind of thing. We have to practice seeing the things in our lives with the lens of gratefulness when so often it so easy to take them for granted. In the blur of Halloween, the costumes and candy, the turkeys and pre-Christmas furry—remember to practice gratefulness.

In the midst of the next several weeks the world will ramp up into a fervor pitch with commercialized Christmas campaigns. It's tempting to either get caught up in the drama of it all or become obsessed with being disgusted by it all. What if there is a third way—what if we lose the noise & everything else and remember to prepare our hearts for the coming of the savior. Advent is the season of preparation. We look to God and re-enter the drama of waiting for a savior. We examine the places in our lives where a savior needs to break through. I think we can let this season be powerful, let it be a time God can grab a hold of our hearts and change us.

The world sometimes feels like a crazy place. But we don't have to let the crazy consume our lives. We can be different, we can let God's rhythms rule our lives rather than the patterns the culture around us would foist on us. Living by God's rhythms might just be a powerful witness to a world that seems to go bonkers this time of year. We might invite our friends and neighbors to join us and share God's grace with them.

# **GIVING THANKS**

In a few short weeks, we will celebrate the Thanksgiving holiday. What comes to mind when you think about that day? Most of us probably think about the tables piled high with delicious food. Maybe we reflect on family traditions, or gathering with family members we haven't seen in a while. Most of the women are probably already preparing for the work that the day brings.

How much time do we spend thinking about God in the midst of our preparations? How much energy do we put into *truly appreciating* all the gifts God has given us, and then expressing our *profound gratitude* to our Lord and Savior? Do we even honestly *acknowledge* that everything we have is a gift from God, not just a result of our own efforts? Webster's Dictionary defines *thanksgiving* as "an act of expressing gratitude, especially to God". In addition to gratitude, Roget's Thesaurus offers several synonyms for thanksgiving including: *acknowledgement, recognition, appreciation, indebtedness and under obligation*. Let's take a quick look at what Scripture has to say about "giving thanks".

**To whom do we give or thanks and praise?** We give our thanks to God (Father, Son, and Holy Spirit)—the Creator of the universe, our loving Shepherd, Redeemer, Savior, and Lord.

Why do we give thanks to God? First of all, because God deserves our thanks and praise. "Let us come before His presence with thanksgiving...For the Lord is a great God" (Ps. 95:2-3, see Ps. 63 and 136). Second, we were created for that purpose. "The people, whom I formed for myself, will declare my praise" (Is. 43:21). Third, we are commanded to give thanks. "Offer to God a sacrifice of thanksgiving" (Ps. 50:14). In Phil. 4:6, we are also encouraged to bring all of our concerns to God with thanksgiving. Fourth, it is good for us, and for our relationship with God. Psalm 92:1-2 states, "It is good to give thanks to the Lord, and to sing praise to thy name, O Most High; to declare thy loving kindness in the morning, and thy faithfulness by night". Finally Jesus provided us an example to follow when he gave thanks to his Father in Heaven (See Matt. 11:25, 26:27; John 6:11, 11:41).

**For what do we give thanks?** In a word, everything! "In everything give thanks; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus" (1 Thess. 5:18). Ephesians 5:20 confirms that we are to be "always giving thanks in all things in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ to God, even the Father". We thank God for who we are, all that we have, and for every gift, blessing and challenge in our lives.

What happens when we give thanks? First, we bring honor and glory to God. Just like a loving parent, it gives God joy when we children recognize and acknowledge what we have received, and show our gratitude for it. Second, giving thanks to God helps us take our eyes off ourselves and our own glory, and place them where they belong—on God. Third, it makes us feel good when we acknowledge all that God has done for us. Finally, we are strengthened in our faith, and blessed by God (See Ps. 1:1-3, 92:12-15).

This Thanksgiving (and always), let's make a point to recognize and acknowledge our indebtedness to God. Then let's respond by expressing our sincere appreciation and profound gratitude for all that we have received! **Thanks be to God!**

With fall in full swing it is a reminder for me that the changing of the seasons is not unlike the changes we might go through in our own lives. Hear His calling: your church needs you! We have two open seats for 2014. Please prayerfully consider serving in this capacity. If there is someone who you think would be an excellent choice to fill one of the spots please let Pastor Mark know.

Finally, the chilly mornings are a reminder that there are many who are sleeping outside and will soon need a warm place to sleep. Your council will seek your approval to once again use the church as a winter shelter. We will have a handout with more information on the shelter available soon.

# Mount Si Lutheran Church's Rich History Trivia

• <u>January 1990</u> Committee formed to plan for access modifications to church facilities.

- April 1992 Elevator installed in church and upstairs bathrooms made accessible.
- <u>July 1992</u> Front steps of church reformed, handicapped parking pads and additional sidewalks installed.
- April 1993 Access modifications done on bathrooms in fellowship building.
- May 8, 1993 Mission statement written.
- October 9, 1993 Vision emphasis developed.
- November 1995 Congregation votes to allow Pastor Anderson to move out of parsonage and purchase his own home. Started renting out the parsonage in summer of 1996.
- June 1999 50th Anniversary Celebration.
- <u>September 2000</u> Rev. Peter Anderson Retires and Congregation continues to prepare for new pastor. Congregation uses ELCA Pastor decision process.
- October 2000-February 28, 2002 Rev. Mikkel Hustad installed as Interim Pastor.

Upon inspecting the steeple once it was on the ground, it was quickly determined that it was no longer structurally sound. The cross was salvaged for a new location at Mount Si Lutheran Church.
- <u>August 30, 2009</u> Pastor Tim's last Sunday at Mount Si Lutheran as Interim Pastor.

# A brief history of Calvary Lutheran Church, Ballard Taken from the book "New Partners, Old Roots" A history of merging Lutheran Churches in the Pacific Northwest

In 1902 three groups of Icelandic people in Seattle joined together to form Hallgrim's Congregation. The three included some who were Unitarian in theology, some who were called "Lutheran Free', and some who were of the more traditional Lutheran heritage. They had no regular minister or place of worship, but held services in various places using the Lutheran order from the Church of Iceland.

Hallgrim's Congregation was formerly organized as a part of the Icelandic Synod in 1925, though at time, most of the "Free" and Unitarian groups had separated. The congregation was served by a student from Pacific Lutheran Seminary in Seattle until they could afford to hire their first minister.

A building known as Calvary Methodist Church was available for purchase in the 1940's. The name "Calvary" continued in the community, so Hallgrim's Congregation became Calvary Lutheran Church.

In 1964 a new structure was erected on the same site and the congregation joined the Lutheran Church in America, Pacific Northwest Synod. The congregation continued to grow and included persons from other heritages, while retaining their rich Icelandic flavor.

As the older members died and their children moved to the suburbs, membership dwindled. After numerous discussions and prayer, the Calvary congregation felt the need to merge with another church. They approached Our Redeemer's Lutheran Church, just a few blocks to the north. This began a period of discernment for both churches. Soon the people of Calvary started worshipping with the Our Redeemer congregation and in the spring of 2008, the merger of Calvary into the Our Redeemer's Congregation took place.

The Calvary property was a part of the merger and it was decided to try to sell the property to another church. A realtor specializing in selling church buildings was hired for the job. After more than two years, and with no offers from a church, the Calvary property was sold to a developer. The beautiful Baptism window at the back of the church was saved and is in storage. The steeple was removed and now proudly sits on top of Mount Si Lutheran Church in North Bend, Washington. The large cross behind the altar and the lamb from the altar were also saved. The developer who purchased the building had plans to salvage much of the building materials and build four homes on the property.

NOTE: The seven children of Hannes & Stina Kristjanson donated the money for the steeple at the time the church was built in 1964. Nancy Kristjanson (seen in photo below) is the widow of Valdimar, aka Valdy, one of the 7 children.

If anyone is interested, there is an Icelandic room at the Nordic Heritage Museum, in which there is information about the church in early times.



# **Eyes to See**

One of the great gifts in serving the office of bishop is the opportunity to be invited to see the many expressions of the ELCA here in the Northwest and throughout the country. The learning curve has been extremely steep and the work very demanding. What balances this is the inspiration and joy that I experience in getting to learn from so many of you.

I am seeing a church that is experiencing great vitality in these many expressions. We have passionate, gifted lay and rostered people who love this church and who serve it well.



What we are experiencing reminds me of the feeding of the 4,000 in Mark. The crowds had been following Jesus and they were weary. Looking out at the landscape of that moment it appeared bleak and surely not enough resources to respond to the hunger.

Jesus asks the disciples to make available what it is that they had - a few loaves and fishes. He then divided the offerings and proceeded to feed the entire crowd with leftovers to spare. The disciples then cross over to other side with Jesus and he warns them to mindful of the yeast of the Pharisees and that of Herod. I suggest to you this is the yeast of scarcity. They wondered if Jesus warned them because they had no bread. Jesus asked them, "Why are you talking about having no bread? Do you still not see and understand?" He then goes on to remind them of how they had witnessed the feeding of the four thousand and the five thousand.

When we focus on what we think is the scarcity of our situation we fail to see the great capacity that we have to meet the needs of a hungry world. I invite you in whatever context you are doing ministry to open your eyes and ears to see and hear where feeding is taking place. Where is there life? Where is their excitement?

May our joy be restored as we begin to see anew what is so right with the Church. All of this made possible by a generous God of grace.


