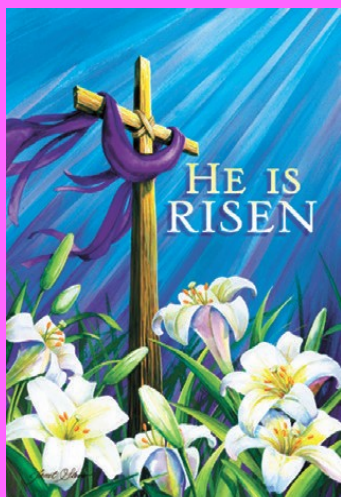

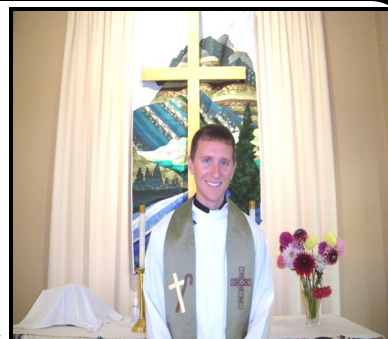

From Pastor Mark's Desk.....

Resurrection People:

Now as we walk through these final days of Lent we notice the shadow of the cross looming larger. In his final days Jesus tried to foreshadow his death and brace the disciples for what was coming. The thought of Jesus' death was incomprehensible. For the disciples, this would have been the mark of ultimate failure. There is no way they would accept the premise that the one they had dared to follow and claim as messiah would die. This not only defied their expectations of the messiah but talking about his death was offensive and crushing. Then to their horror their fears were realized. What Jesus had told them came to pass as he died a gruesome death on the cross. As we pass through Holy Week we try to imagine the drama of this unfolding for the first time. We try to imagine the fear and failure those first followers must have felt. And for three days they kept a holy vigil. I think they were mostly just so scared they didn't know what else to do but stay put and wait.



Then early one morning of the third day, after the Sabbath was over, they heard news from the tomb. It was empty; How could this be? What does this mean? Then the whispers and rumors began to fly—Jesus lives. The one we watched die on the cross didn't stay dead. The gates of death did not prevail and Jesus rose from the grave. In that moment of God's glory burst forth and life was forever changed. Life was changed because death was defeated. No longer would people live bound in fear of death. Rather, now life was unencumbered from that burden and all of creation breathed anew. A place of failure and death became a place of life and abundance.

We are just like those early disciples who were shaped by this story; we too become resurrection people. No longer bound by the fear of failure and death, resurrection people know that God is the life breather not the death dealer. And now in this new found freedom God's people live in Christ and are blown forward into the world to tell the story of new life.

So this Easter season, and beyond, remember: you are a child of the resurrection. You are free, forgiven, and blessed with life abundant. What fears will you let go of? What anxious thoughts will you stop revisiting over and over again? From what bonds do you need to be loosed? After all ours is the God who, in the defeat of death, revealed the power of new life!

Go out into the world be free, be bold, be quick to tell the story of life.

PRAYER MUST BE YOUR TOP PRIORITY (2)

“I want men everywhere to lift up holy hands in prayer” (1 Tim 2:8 NIV)

In training Timothy for ministry, Paul wanted him to understand how the church works. So he began with the important stuff like: prayer. In essence, Paul was saying, “Before you do anything else, pray. Before you teach anything else, teach your people to pray.” Why? Because if God’s not on your side you won’t succeed! Most of us understand this intellectually. We say a quick prayer as we’re running out the door. We say grace before a meal. We open our church services with prayer. But few of us grasp the real importance of prayer, and Paul didn’t want Timothy to be misled or misinformed about the real importance of prayer in the church. We dare not fool ourselves into thinking we can “make things happen” without prayer. If a church isn’t a praying church, it doesn’t matter how well the pastor preaches or the choir sings, or how nice the building is. For it succeed, Jesus said, “My house shall be a house of prayer” (Luke 19:46 NAS). Oswald Chambers said, “We look upon prayer as a means of getting things for ourselves: The Bible idea of prayer is that we may get to know God himself.” You aren’t coming to church just to hear a lively sermon or a good song, you’re coming to meet with God. The pastor and choir are vehicles through which He can speak, but there’s no substitute for prayer. It’s not merely a nice sentiment; your spiritual growth and survival depend on it. So if you’ve gotten out of the habit of praying—this year get back into it!

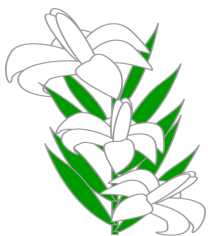
Adult Class

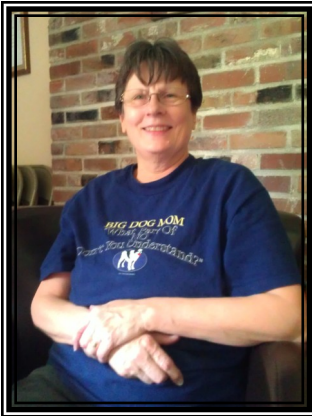

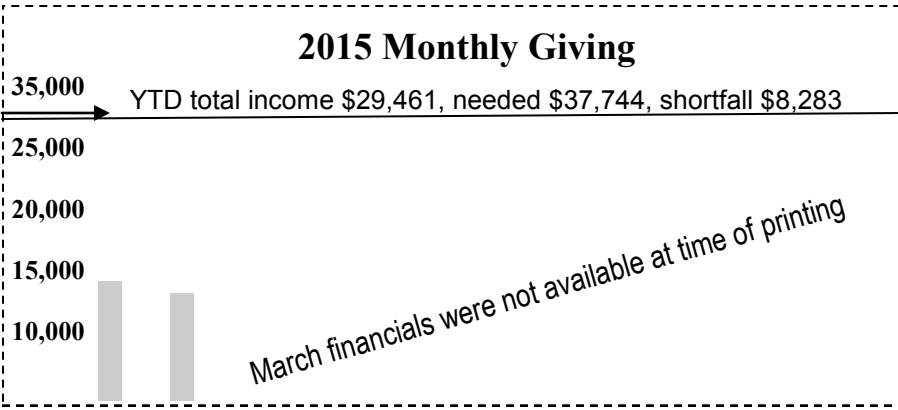

Not a Winter Guy

I am not a winter guy.

I hate being cold, which I often am. Day after day of damp, wet weather cuts at me. The darkness weighs upon me. I resent waking to the dark and before my work day ends, it is dark already. I am prone to depression in the winter and have to up my self-care. No doubt I have at least a tinge of Seasonal Affective Disorder.

My fireplace is a wonderful friend. Life is good when I wake in the morning, put flame to the fire, grab the newspaper and savor two cups of freshly brewed coffee. I know the heat is just about right when the other family members exclaim, "Dad it is way too hot in here."

I am the guy who is aware of the shortest day of the year because following it I report to anyone who will listen: "We had a few more minutes of daylight, did you notice?" Winter is for me my time of endurance. It is my marathon.

One of the gifts of serving in this office is I find myself more frequently in Chicago. Chicago is God's way of reminding me how good I really have it. I might just die if I lived in Chicago year round.

Now that you know more about my love affair with winter you will understand why this past week my soul was revived and my spirit excited. Last week right at daybreak I heard for the first time since early fall the birds singing in our back yard. I had to turn off the heater in the bathroom to confirm that in fact it was the birds singing that I was hearing.

It was faint but delightful. A holy sound. Once I locked on to the sound I stood silent in it for several minutes. I know the birds sing the spring in. Their song is their prayer that the leaves will return and blossoms of new life will sprout. It is a beautiful processional song right up there with Lift High the Cross. The cross is lifted and I know daylight and warmth are on their way.

Easter for me is more than a single Sunday. Easter for me is when I know that life is good again and that it means me well. Easter is when my soul is restored and spirits rise. Easter is when the birds in the back yard remind me after a time of my own darkness. He is Risen! He is Risen Indeed!

For so many of you, whom I know and love, who are going through your own time of darkness, listen for the song of Easter. May you know the power of Easter to heal and make us whole again. Rise early and listen to the birds sing.

My beloved speaks and says to me:

"Arise, my love, my fair one, and come away; for now the winter is past, the rain is over and gone.

The flowers appear on the earth; the time of singing has come, and the voice of the turtledove is heard in our land."



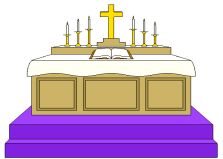
Flower Chart for the Sanctuary
